Addressing the challenges of managing an effective BSA program.

Overview



This 2-day program is designed for BSA professionals who are competent in the core requirements of Bank Secrecy Act rules and will provide a higher level of lecture, training, and interactive discussion regarding the challenges of developing and managing an effective BSA program. Much of the discussion will revolve around real life case studies which will be an integral part of the school.

This school will also address the customer due diligence (CDD) rules which became effective May 11, 2018, addressing the requirements for verifying the ultimate beneficial owners for business accounts, and any up to the minute changes.

A major focus of the program will be managing a BSA program. Topics will include discussions on ethics, efficiency vs. effectiveness, dealing with examinations, escalating issues within the organization, and managing MSB relationships. In addition, the class will learn to design an effective BSA program through the study of workflow charts, which will be provided. We will discuss best practices for impacting the bottom line of a BSA program and we will discuss a policy checklist, as well as how to conduct a gap analysis to ensure your program is as refined as possible.

The course will rely heavily on a roundtable discussion. The facilitator will guide the group through a number of pre-determined discussion topics, as well as topics requested by the attendees. Each attendee is encouraged to contribute at least one topic they would like to discuss – and attendees will be solicited for topics prior to the school.

All assignments will be based on the lecture material, followed by hands on analysis completed in a group format, and/or guided general class discussion. While this program is not designed to teach the basic elements of BSA, those new to BSA may find this program beneficial in regards to the management nature of the program.
